



Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering;




If you have been foolish in exalting yourself, Or if you have devised evil, put your hand on your mouth.

For as the churning of milk produces butter, And wringing the nose produces blood, So the forcing of wrath produces strife. NKJV




Wives, submit to your own husbands, as is fitting in the Lord.

19 Husbands, love your wives and do not be bitter toward them. NKJV




If anyone among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this one's religion is useless. NKJV


¹ My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive a stricter judgment.

2 For we all stumble in many things. If anyone does not stumble in word, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle the whole body. NKJV




James 3:1-2


Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers. NKJV




And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you. NKJV




Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one. NKJV
